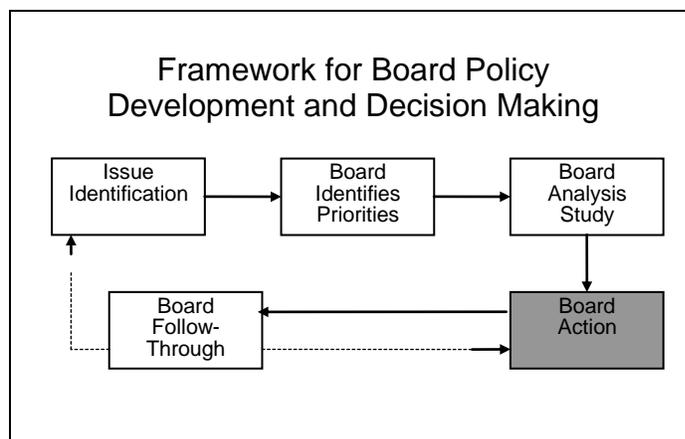


# Iowa State Board of Education

## Executive Summary

July 27, 2011



- Agenda Item:** Rules: Chapter 22 - Senior Year Plus Program (Notice)
- Iowa Goal:** All K-12 students will achieve at a high level.
- Equity Impact Statement:** All school districts and accredited nonpublic schools are governed by these rules, which implement the provisions of the Senior Year Plus legislation.

- Recommendation:** It is recommended that the State Board give public notice of its intent to amend Chapter 22.
- Background:** 2011 Iowa Acts, Senate File 470, section 12, struck Iowa Code section 261E.8, subsection 5, which had provided that the parent or guardian of a student attending a community college under concurrent enrollment “shall furnish transportation to and from the community college for the student.” School districts receive supplementary funds from the state on behalf of students who participate in concurrent enrollment courses. These funds, in part, are to assist a school district in providing student transportation to and from concurrent enrollment courses.

## **EDUCATION DEPARTMENT [281]**

### **Notice of Intended Action**

Pursuant to the authority of Iowa Code section 256.7(5), the State Board of Education hereby proposes to amend Chapter 22, “Senior Year Plus Program,” Iowa Administrative Code.

2011 Iowa Acts, Senate File 470, section 12, struck Iowa Code section 261E.8, subsection 5, which had provided that the parent or guardian of a student attending a community college under concurrent enrollment “shall furnish transportation to and from the community college for the student.” School districts receive supplementary funds from the state on behalf of students who participate in concurrent enrollment courses. These funds, in part, are to assist a school district in providing student transportation to and from concurrent enrollment courses.

After analysis and review of this rule making, no impact on jobs has been found.

An agency-wide waiver provision is provided in 281—chapter 4.

A public hearing will be held on September 13, 2011, from 1 to 2 p.m., in the State Board Room on the second floor of the Grimes State Office Building, East 14th Street and Grand Avenue, Des Moines, Iowa, at which time persons may present their views either orally or in writing. This amendment is intended to implement 2011 Iowa Acts, Senate File 460, section 12.

The following amendment is proposed.

Adopt the following **new** rule **281—22.12(261E)**:

**281—22.12(261E) Transportation.** The school district of enrollment shall make available to eligible students who are enrolled in and are attending an eligible postsecondary institution under this division transportation to and from the postsecondary institution.
