

### Addendum E: Dropout Definitions, 2009-2010

According to the CCD definition, a dropout is an individual who

- was enrolled in school at some time during the 0910 school year (on or after October 1, 2009)
- is not enrolled as of Count Day 2010
- has not graduated from high school or completed a state- or district-approved education program; and
- does not meet any of the following exclusionary conditions:
  - a. transfer to another public school district, private school, or state- or district-approved education programs
  - b. temporary absence due to suspension or school –approved illness; or
  - c. death

For the purpose of this definition:

- 1) The school year is the 12-month period of time beginning on Count Day.
- 2) Dropouts from the previous summer reported for the year and grade in which they fail to enroll. For example, a student completing 10<sup>th</sup> grade in 0910, who does not enroll the next year would be reported as an 11<sup>th</sup> grade dropout for 1011.
- 2) Individuals who are not accounted for on October 1 are considered dropouts
- 3) A school completer is an individual who graduated from high school or completed a state- or district-approved educational program upon receipt of formal recognition of school authorities.

*(The above definition was taken from NCES publication 2010-313)*

The above definitions/qualifications translate into the following for state reporting of dropouts in Iowa:

A dropout is 7 thru 12 student whose most recent Entry code is a BEDS entry code\* who...

1. Completed the 0910 school year but was unaccounted for as of October 1, 2010. NOTE: this includes students completing the 6<sup>th</sup> grade but being unaccounted for in the fall of their 7<sup>th</sup> grade year
2. Enrolled in a program designed to earn a GED or a community college adult education program diploma
3. Had an unresolved Exit Code from October 1, 2009 to Sept 30, 2010 (e.g., within district transfer with no following entry, transfer to unknown, etc.)
4. Reached Maximum Age by Sept 15, 2010
5. Was reported as transferred to, open enrolled, or tuitioned out to another Iowa public school district but was never reported by the new district. (NOTE: The last school of attendance/reporting on record is the district responsible for this drop)
6. Is under the age of 16 as of Sept 15, 2010, and transfers to home-schooling without completing CPI paperwork.
7. Enrolls in Job Corps in Denison but opts out of pursuing high school diploma
8. Does not re-enroll in a district after serving expulsion

\* BEDS Entry Codes for this purpose include the following: '1' (Enrolled), '2' (Open Enrolled In), '3' (Tuitioned In Parent Paid), '4' (Tuitioned In District Paid), '5' (WGS In), '10' (Tuitioned In Out of State), '15' (Tuitioned In State Paid), and '19' (Foreign Student on Visa)
