

Course Coding Non-Secondary Level Courses

Framework for Non-Secondary Level Course Codes

Elements of the Coding Structure

The framework for non-secondary level course codes consists of three basic elements plus a "filler" (000):

1. Course Description consists of two parts, a Subject Area and a Course Title within that Subject Area. For example, the course Third Grade Mathematics is coded 52033: Subject Area is Elementary Mathematics (52) and Course Title is Mathematics - Grade 3 (033)

Subject Area. There are numerous content categories for elementary courses. For the 2010-2011 school year the focus will be **only** on the areas of Language Arts/Reading (51), Mathematics (52) (grades 3 thru 8) and Science (grades 5 and 8). Each of these areas is represented by a two-digit code.

Course Title. Courses within each Subject Area are distinguished by a three-digit code. Course titles for non-secondary level courses are on the back of this sheet.

2. Course Level for all courses at the non-secondary level will be 'X' or 'S'. 'S' is used only for specially funded course (e.g., special education, ELL, Title I, etc). All other courses will have a level of 'X'.

3. Filler: The static value for the 7th, 8th, and 9th character in all non-secondary level courses is 000

4. Grade Span: Indicates the grade span for which the course is intended.

Example: The course code for a 3rd Grade Mathematics course would be as follows:

Example: The course code for a Title I Reading course for 3th and 4th graders would be as follows:

<u>51</u>	<u>043</u>	<u>S</u>	<u>000</u>	<u>34</u>
English Language and Literature	Reading	Specially Funded	Static Filler	Intended for grades 3 thru 4

For **Non-Departmentalized Non-Secondary Classrooms** in which Language Arts, Mathematics, Reading (grades 3 thru 8) and Science (grades 5 and 8) are all taught by the same teacher course coding is optional (the connection between student and teacher will be made thru the Homeroom /HSAP Teacher Folder Number).

Departmentalized Non-Secondary Classrooms in which Language Arts, Mathematics, Reading and/or Science are taught by different teachers and length of course "seat time" varies by day and/or week.
