Items to Verify on the Accreditation Report

The SCED course title (first five digits of SCED code) and the local course title should align. They do not have to be an exact match.

Items to Verify on the Accreditation Report

Carnegie Unit is correct for each course

Carnegie unit is a portion of 7200 minutes

- Course meets for one period every day for one semester = 0.50 Carnegie Unit
- Concurrent Enrollment course taught online or on community college campus = contact minutes/7200

JMC Districts

Courses with a Term Type of

Year-Sem or Year–Tri

- JMC will send multiple course records, one for each term
- Local course number will have letter appended
- Carnegie Unit in SCED code will be split accordingly
- Tenth digit in SCED code will be sequenced accordingly

JMC Districts, cont.

Example: Algebra I

- Local Course Number: 126
- Term Type: Year-Sem
- SCED Code: 02052G10000

The following will be sent in Student Reporting file -

Local Course Number	Local Course Name	SCED Code

JMC Districts, cont.

If you find a semester or trimester long course with a Term Type of Year-Sem or Year-Tri, contact JMC. You are unable to change the Term Type without deleting grade book information.

Items to Verify on the Accreditation Report

Courses are sequenced appropriately so Carnegie units are correctly calculated

Year long courses broken into terms must be sequenced by term.

Multiple years of courses that use the same first five digits in the SCED code must be sequenced by year.

Two courses with different content that use the same first five digits in the SCED code must be sequenced by term. This does not mean one course is a prerequisite of the other.

A semester long course taught in both semesters must have the same SCED code. In this case there is no sequencing of term.

A course taught at different levels will only count as one course. The SCED code differs only in the level. No sequencing of term needed.

Courses with the same content where a student can take either or but not both count as one course and should have identical SCED codes. No sequencing of term needed.

Two courses with the same content but taught using different methods of delivery count as one course. The SCED code for the two courses must be identical. No sequencing of term needed.

Items to Verify on the Accreditation Report

- All eligible courses being taught are represented.

Courses eligible to be used for accreditation will have one of the following course origination codes:

Course Origination	Description
1	Local District Course taught by district teacher
11	Local District Course taught by non-district teacher
3	Concurrent Enrollment/ Not Career Academy (<u>can only count toward Vocational accreditation area</u>)
4	Jointly Administered course for High School Credit
5	District to district sharing
6	Iowa Learning Online
7	Iowa Online AP Academy
9	Concurrent Enrollment/ Career Academy (<u>can only count toward Vocational accreditation area</u>)
10	Regional Academy Course

Not all courses are eligible to be used towards accreditation

- PSEO
- Concurrent Enrollment – except in Vocational
- Transfer in courses
- Independent study courses that are not board approved
- Correspondence courses
- Credit recovery courses
- Specially funded courses (ELL, special education, etc.)
- Purchased on-line internet based courses (PLATO, E2020, ALEX, etc.)

Missing a Course?

- If a course is missing from an accreditation area, check the accreditation area for the courses in your SIS. The default setting for Accreditation Program Area is '0' Not Used for Accreditation.
